A Mesa woman experienced a delay in receiving her Social Security benefits after a fraudulent SBA loan appeared on her record. Rep. Stanton stepped in and worked to clear the fraudulent loan.

FIGHTING TO LOWER COSTS

Too many families can't afford the basics.

Rep. Stanton is fighting to bring prices down — because Arizonans deserve better than what they're getting from Washington.



Republican leaders in Washington did not vote to extend cost-saving Affordable Care Act tax credits before December 31, 2025, driving up costs for more than 33,000 residents of Arizona's Fourth District.¹

Rep. Stanton has worked with a bipartisan coalition in the House to force a vote on a clean three-year extension of these critical tax credits, which will reduce premiums and protect coverage.

Rep. Stanton stood against cuts to SNAP that stripped food assistance from millions of families;² backed legislation to protect nutrition programs from being slashed to pay for tax breaks; and led the fight against trade policies that threaten to raise grocery prices.

TARIFFS



Rep. Stanton meets with small business owners in downtown Chandler, brewery operators in Tempe alongside Gov. Katie Hobbs, and an aerospace manufacturer in Chandler. All shared how they have been hit hard by tariffs.

After Trump announced his sweeping tariff policies, Rep. Stanton traveled across Arizona to speak to business owners: aerospace manufacturers, clothing retailers, housing developers, and even local breweries. Every single one said the same thing: costs are up and business is down.

Arizona families are feeling the pinch, too. Analysis from the Joint Economic Committee showed that Trump's tariffs cost families \$1,200 each this year.

That's why Rep. Stanton is leading the fight against this abuse of executive power, introducing legislation to bring tariff authority back to Congress, where it belongs under the Constitution.

STANDING UP FOR ARIZONA

No matter who is in the White House, Rep. Stanton will always stand up for Arizona's interests and our values.

This year, Rep. Stanton stood against Trump administration policies that threatened to harm Arizona families, schools, and communities.

He secured the release of \$110+ million in withheld federal funding for Arizona schools and successfully pushed back on plans to cut Social Security disability benefits for seniors.

When the Trump administration closed the regional Head Start office overseeing Arizona programs, Stanton demanded it be reopened; when the State Department initially terminated visas for international ASU students, he intervened to help dozens of affected students; and he's fought back against changes to homelessness funding that would roll back progress.

SECURING OUR WATER

Rep. Stanton is investing in water solutions that work.

Our future — our economy, our livelihood, whether generations will be able to live here—depends entirely on water. As Arizona fights to protect its precious Colorado River water, Rep. Stanton has used his bully pulpit as a Member of Congress to call for basin-wide compromise and cooperation.

Amid a historic drought, Rep. Stanton is working in Washington to safeguard our water supply by investing millions in water infrastructure solutions. Stanton has worked to invest in technology like advanced water purification and an Interconnection Facility that will give Valley communities greater flexibility. Also this year, the Pascua Yaqui Tribe in Southern Arizona also broke ground on the first project to be funded under Stanton's Environmental Infrastructure Authority, a fund he created in his first term to provide grants to small, rural or tribal communities.



Rep. Stanton has introduced the Heat Management Assistance Grant Act to create a quick-release FEMA grant program that provides state, local, territorial, and tribal governments with immediate funding for emergency response during extreme heat events and the Heat Emergency Assistance for Transportation Act to unlock Federal Highway Administration funding for infrastructure damaged by extreme temperatures.

When the Trump administration canceled FEMA’s Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) program, Rep. Stanton introduced bipartisan legislation to restore this critical resilience funding.

REPRESENTING ARIZONA ABROAD

Rep. Stanton has worked to elevate our state’s strategic interests on the global stage.



Rep. Stanton traveled to the Philippines, Vietnam and Singapore this year to participate in the Shangri-la Dialogue, an annual international security conference alongside heads of state and international business leaders.

As Arizona’s voice on the House Foreign Affairs Committee and the Select Committee on Strategic Competition with the Chinese Communist Party, Rep. Stanton has worked to elevate our state’s strategic interests on the global stage.

As the new chair of the Taiwan Caucus, Rep. Stanton championed one of Arizona’s most critical international partnerships and ensured stability for TSMC’s transformative investments in our state. Rep. Stanton also advanced his Semiconductor Supply Chain Security and Diversification Act to build a resilient Western Hemisphere semiconductor supply chain.

Recognizing that border security requires regional cooperation, Rep. Stanton introduced and passed the American Cooperation With Our Neighbors Act through the House to combat fentanyl trafficking by strengthening law enforcement partnerships, enhancing coordination between governments and community leaders, and providing border towns with critical resources.


COMMON SENSE SOLUTIONS

ADDRESSING THE HOUSING SHORTAGE

Stanton introduced the bipartisan CHARGE Investments Act, which unlocks federal financing for affordable housing along the Light Rail line.



CUTTING RED TAPE FOR INFRASTRUCTURE

Recognizing that outdated bureaucratic processes slow critical infrastructure projects, Stanton introduced the Interactive Federal Review Act to pilot digital, cloud-based platforms that speed up environmental analysis and community engagement.



FIXING OUR ROADS

Stanton introduced the bipartisan Highway Formula Fairness Act to update funding formulas based on Census data, ensuring rapidly growing western states receive their fair share of Highway Trust Fund dollars.




CURBING TRAFFIC CONGESTION

Stanton introduced bipartisan legislation extending states' authority to allow alternative fuel vehicles, like electric cars and hybrids, to use HOV lanes.

CHAMPIONING ACCESSIBLE INNOVATION

MAKING AIR TRAVEL SAFER FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

Rep. Stanton is leading efforts to protect the rights of the 5.5 million Americans who rely on wheelchairs and mobility devices when they travel by air. He has fought for stronger airline accountability after securing provisions in the FAA Reauthorization of 2024.



EXPANDING LAST-MILE TRANSIT

Stanton introduced the bipartisan Improving Accessibility Through Microtransit Act, modeled after a successful service at the City of Chandler, to improve last-mile transit for people with disabilities.



MAKING AVs MORE ACCESSIBLE

Stanton introduced the bipartisan Autonomous Vehicle Accessibility Act to help people with disabilities better access the mobility and independence benefits of ride-hail AVs, a technology pioneered here in the Valley.
