I am requesting funding for Mesa Police Domestic Violence Police Vehicles in Fiscal Year 2027. The entity to receive funding for this project is the City of Mesa, located at 20 E Main St, Mesa, AZ 85201.

The funding would be used for the purchase of seven unmarked police department vehicles to enhance the operational capacity of Mesa Police Department's Domestic Violence Unit and the Victim Services Division. The project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because this will enable Mesa Police Department to increase victim engagement, improve domestic violence apprehension rates, and enhance the safety of both City personnel and victims.
